Our office has received an incident report for violence indicating threats to one or more federal employees. Due to the nature of the incident report, a Zero Tolerance Policy based on Health and Safety will be enforced. This will result in a temporary emergency suspension level 2 with a recommendation for PERMANENT LOSS OF HOUSING. While the Emergency Level 2 is not currently appealable, the Permanent Loss of Housing is. Your deadline to set up your hearing will be as follows:

In addition, a No Contact Order is in place between you and the federal employees that were involved in the altercation. Please refer to the No Contact Order for instructions.

While awaiting the appeal, you will be placed on Emergency Suspension Level II. Please refer to the Emergency Suspension Form to know the requirements of this action.

IMPORTANT: If you do appeal this decision, the Student Rights Specialist will make an appointment and a Student Conduct Board will meet. A decision will be made on the case based on the information in the report and any other evidence set forth by the Student Code of Conduct.


These are your rights at this appeal:

1. You may have a witness(s) present.

- 2. You may have a representative, parent, guardian, or legal lay counsel present.
- 3. The Student Conduct Board will decide your case.
- 4. You do not have to testify against yourself.
- 5. You will receive written summary of the decision and the reasons for the decision.
- Once the decision is made all sanctions will be final.
